

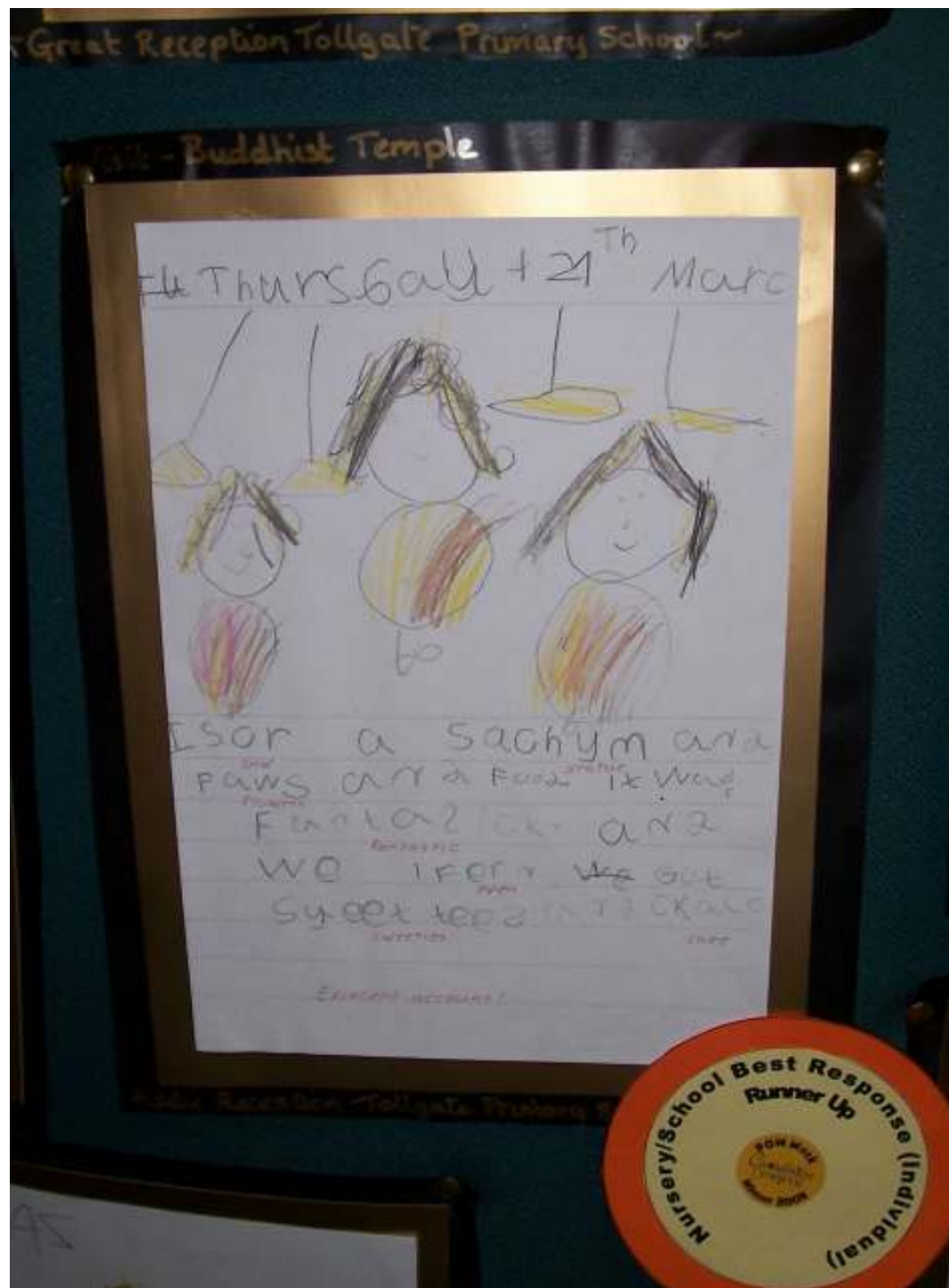

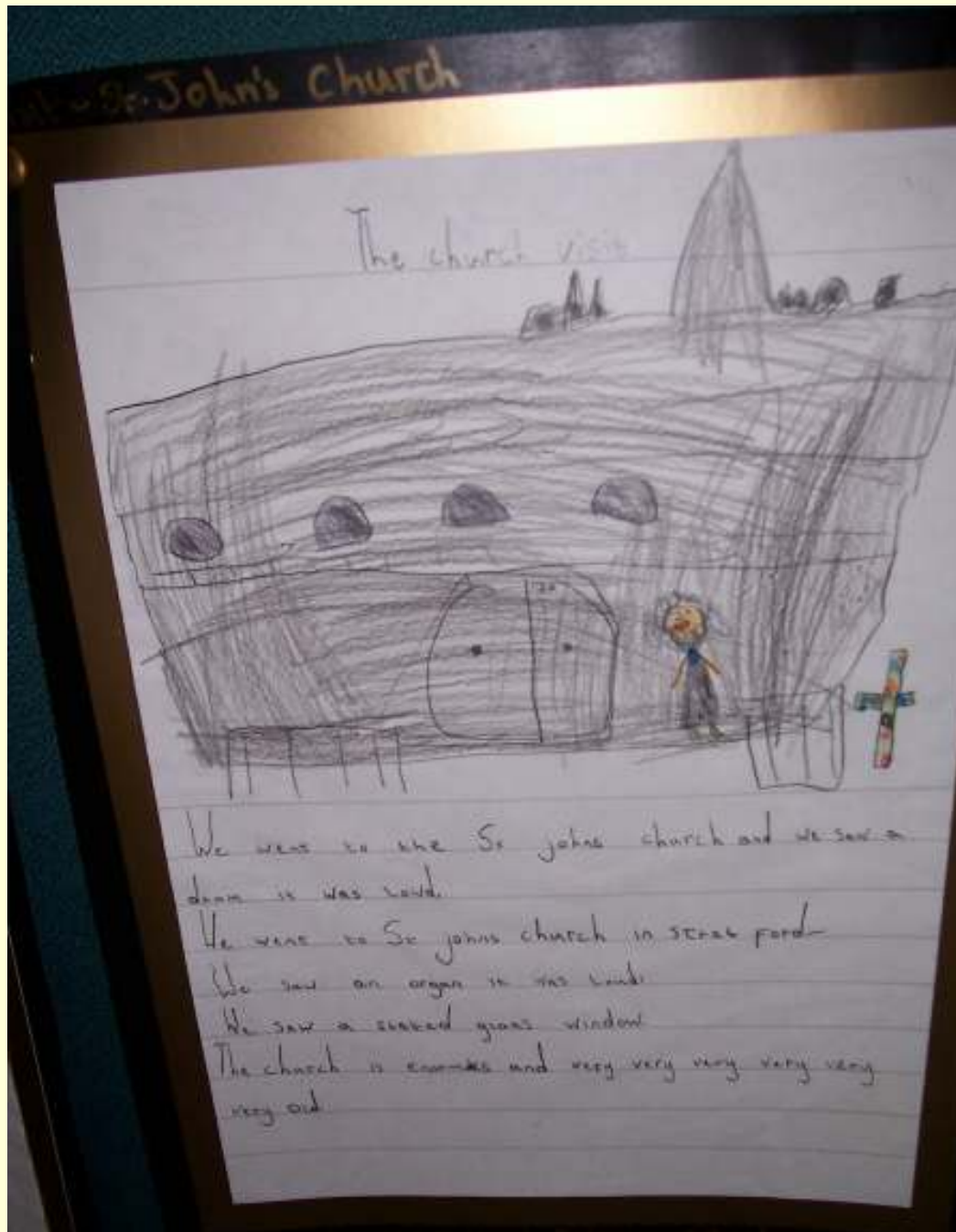

Joy Nwandu, 4M from Rosetta primary, for her report written after her visit to a Synagogue. The judges particularly liked joy's sense



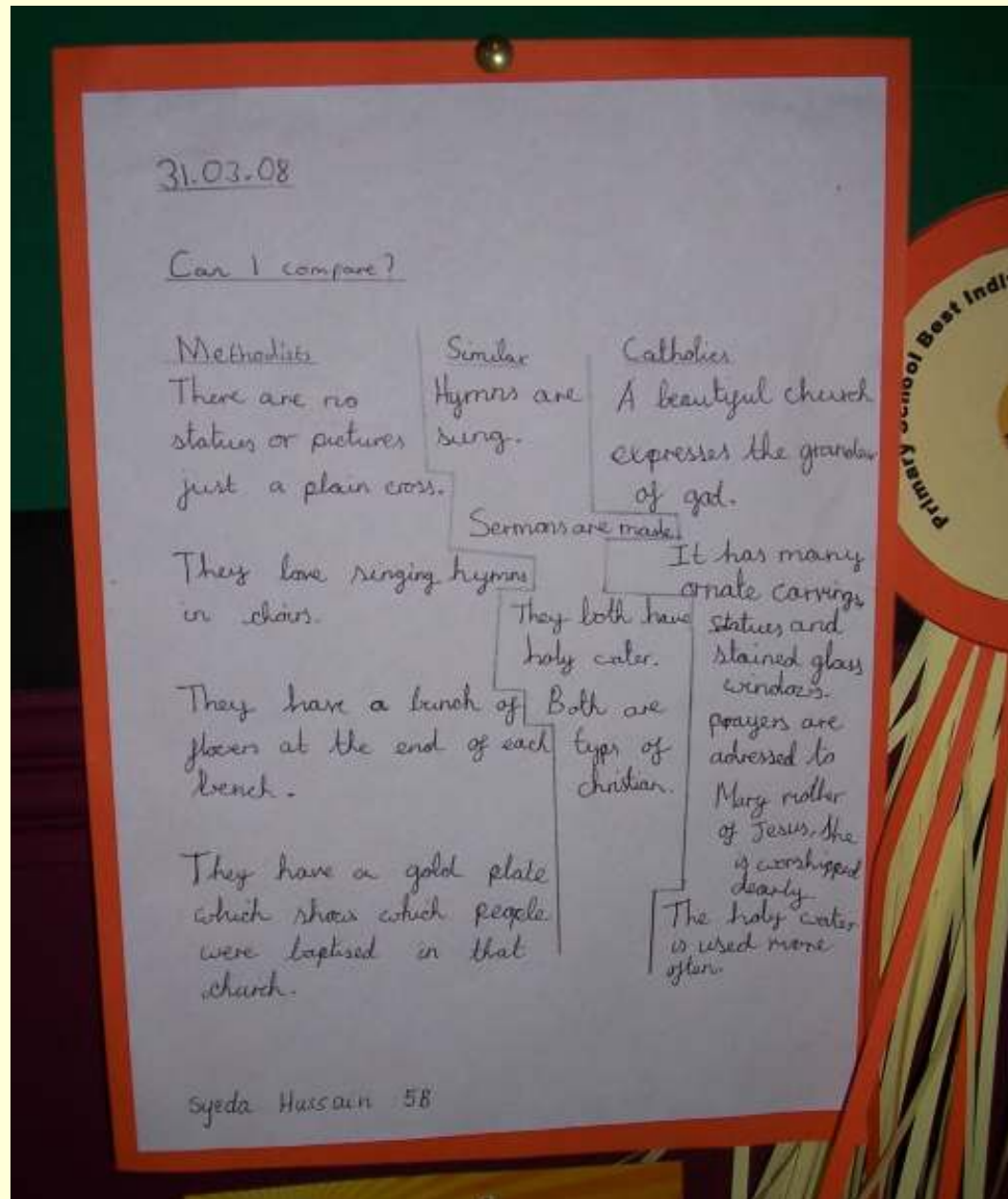
Winners of best class in Years 3&4

Winners of best runner up class in Years 3&4 **Vicarage year 3** for the descriptions of their trip to a place of worship, and reflections of having been there on their return.

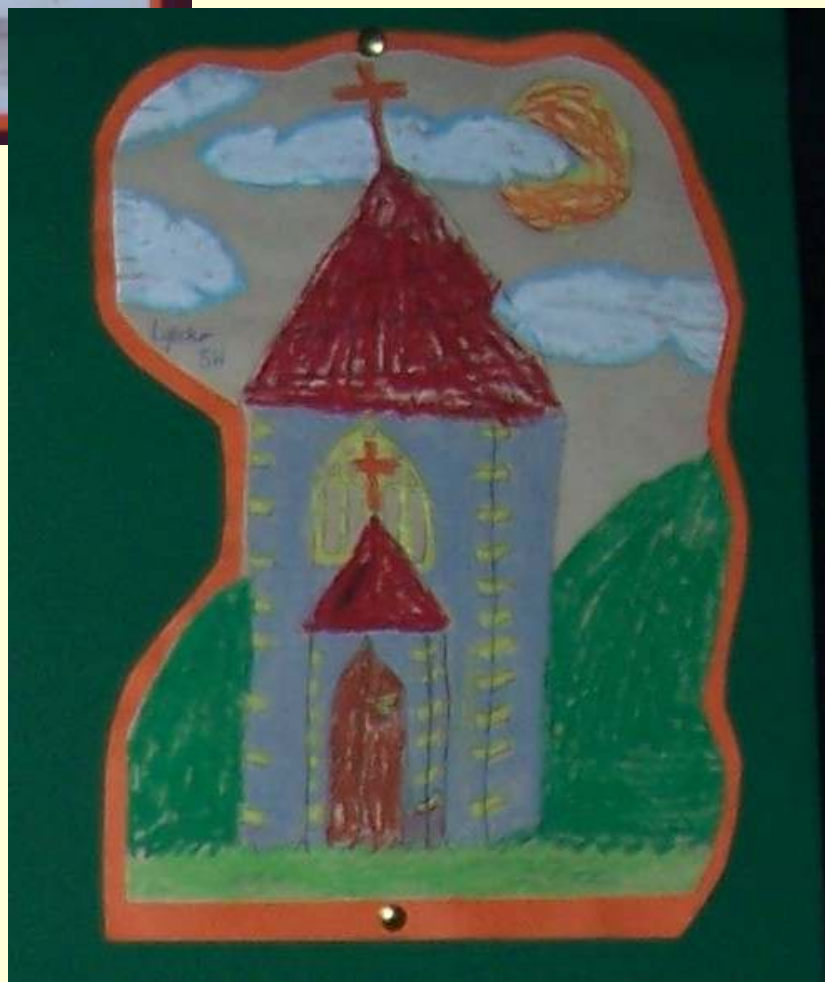
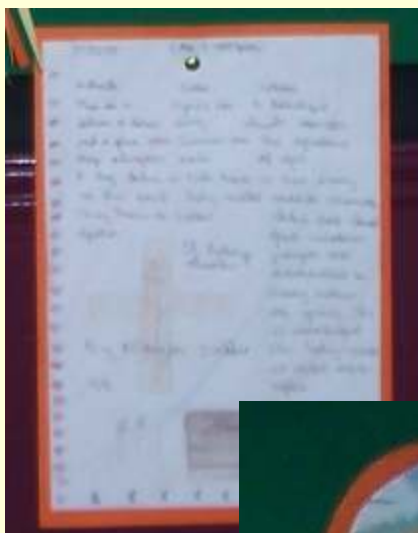


And for **Tollgate Primary year 3's** excellent imaginative work after their visit to a Mosque and a church

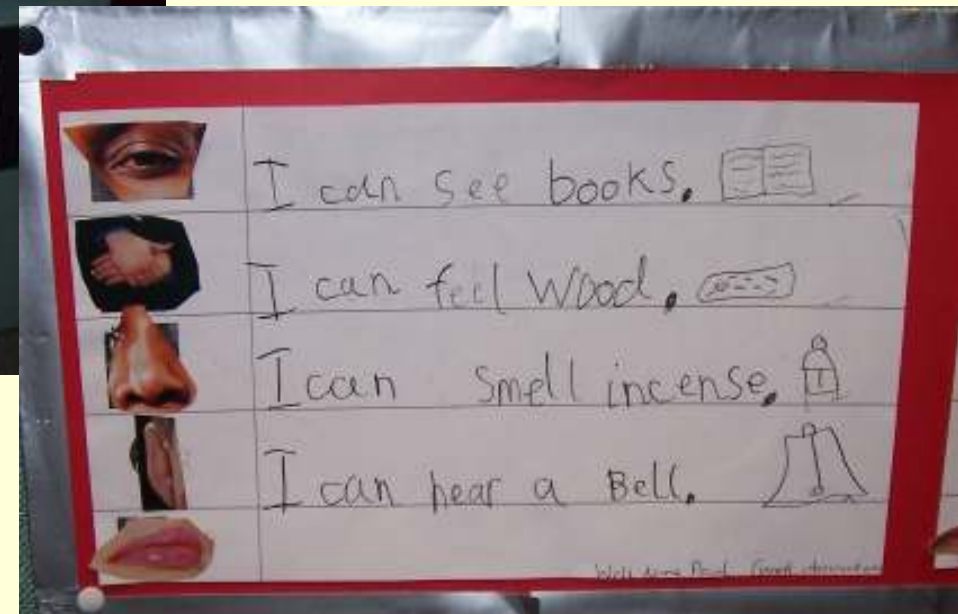


Winner of best individual work in Years 5&6 was **Syeda Hussain, class 5B from Upton Cross.**
