The judges particularly liked the collaborative a work as well as the children's obvious enjoyment of the visit they had been on to the Temple.





The judges particularly liked all the different elements of this art work on fabric.




Joint winners of the Best School at Key Stage 1 was Selwyn Primary




for their creative and beautiful work in Year 1 from their visit to a Temple and Year 2's creation of stain glass windows from old carrier bags.

The Temple is so pleasant Warm and so friendly It is there when you need it And will be there for you It calms you when you're worried or scared So go to the Temple as it is for you





Joint best individual work from Years 5&6 Maryam, Year 6 from **Shaftesbury** Primary, for her poem that she wrote having visited three different places of worship.




