

There was a porch where we were waiting until it was ok to go in. The girls were putting on their head scarfs and even the female teachers had to as well. This was to show respect to their religion. The boys didn't have to wear anything but some wore religious hats. We walked in and there stood a lady. She told us to stand in a semi-circle. After the lady greeted us in Arabic and we greeted her back, but for those who didn't know she explained to us how to reply back in Arabic. She guided us to the prayer room and she said to take off

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our shoes for respect. One things she was talking about was that ladies aren't allowed to lead the prayer because they are weak. Also she told us that an Imaan is a man who leads the prayer. After she had finished she took us to an exhibition about Islam and shared with us a tape of somebody praying just before lunch time. Just before we left all of the Muslims had to pray whilst the non-Muslims watched. By the time they finished it was time to go back to school.

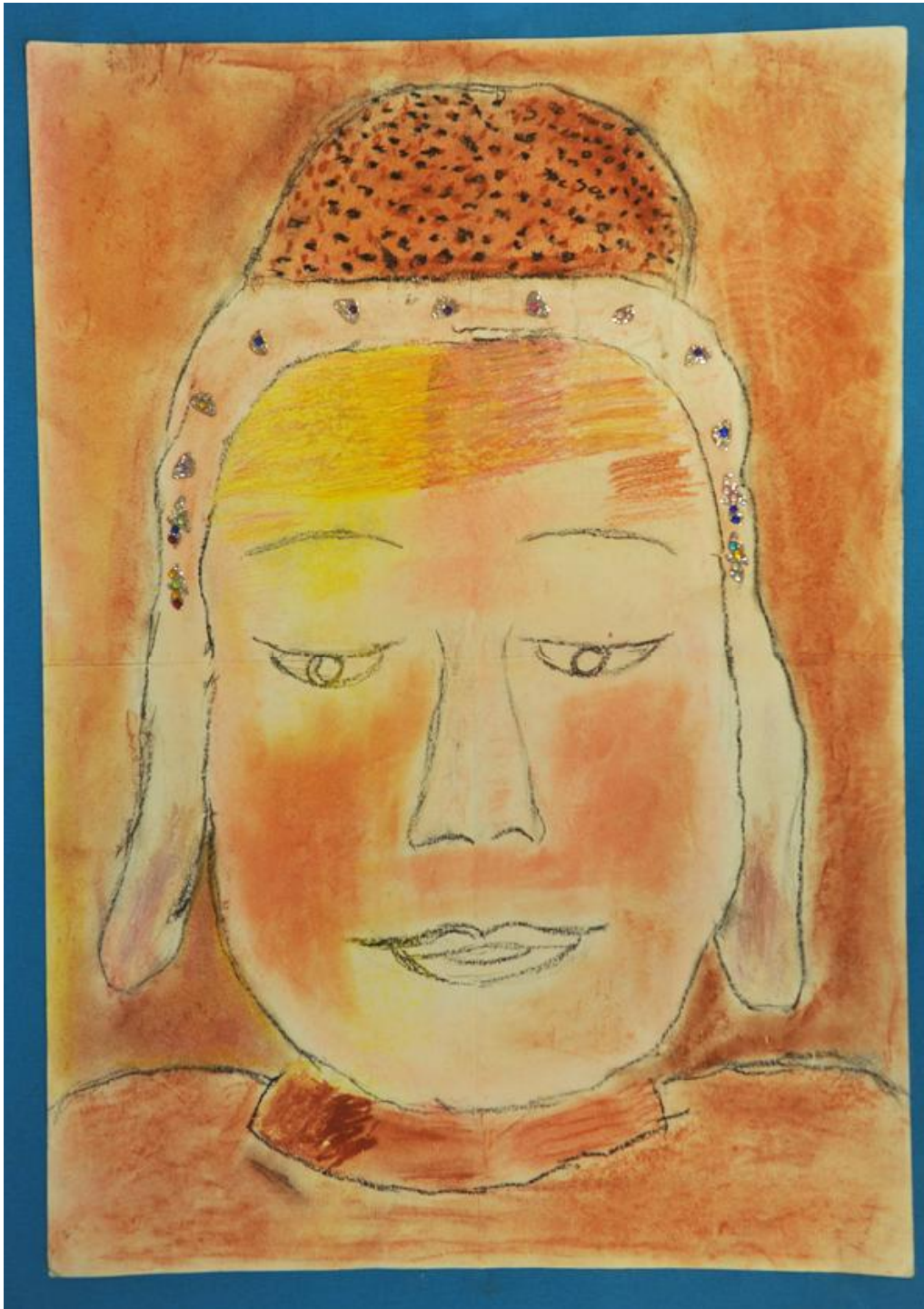

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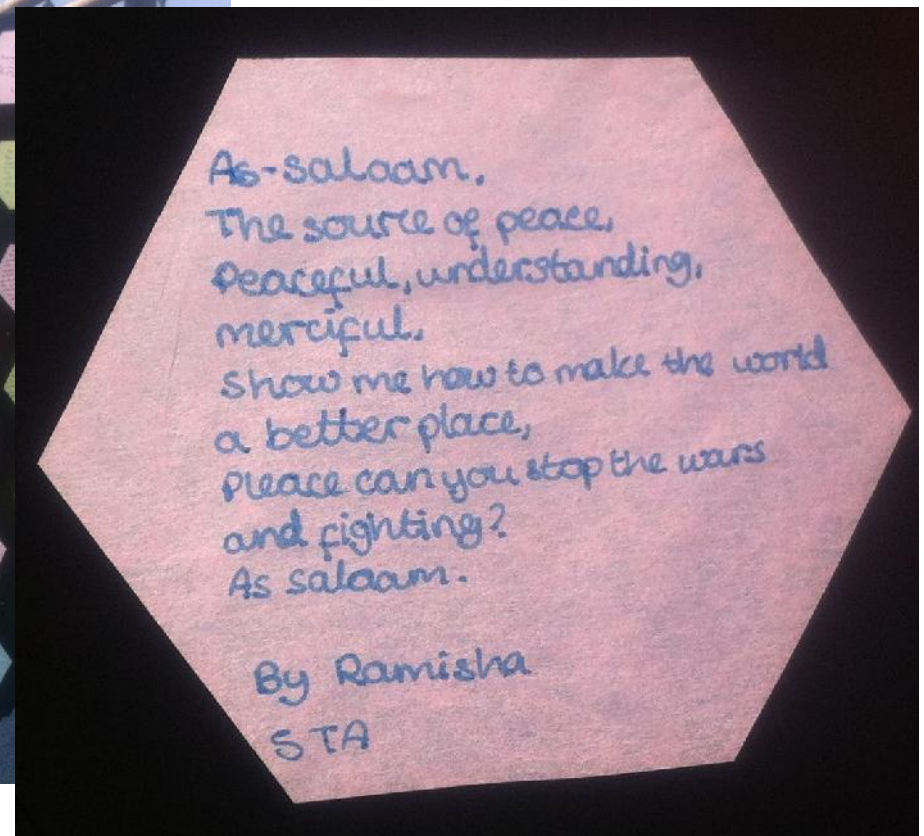
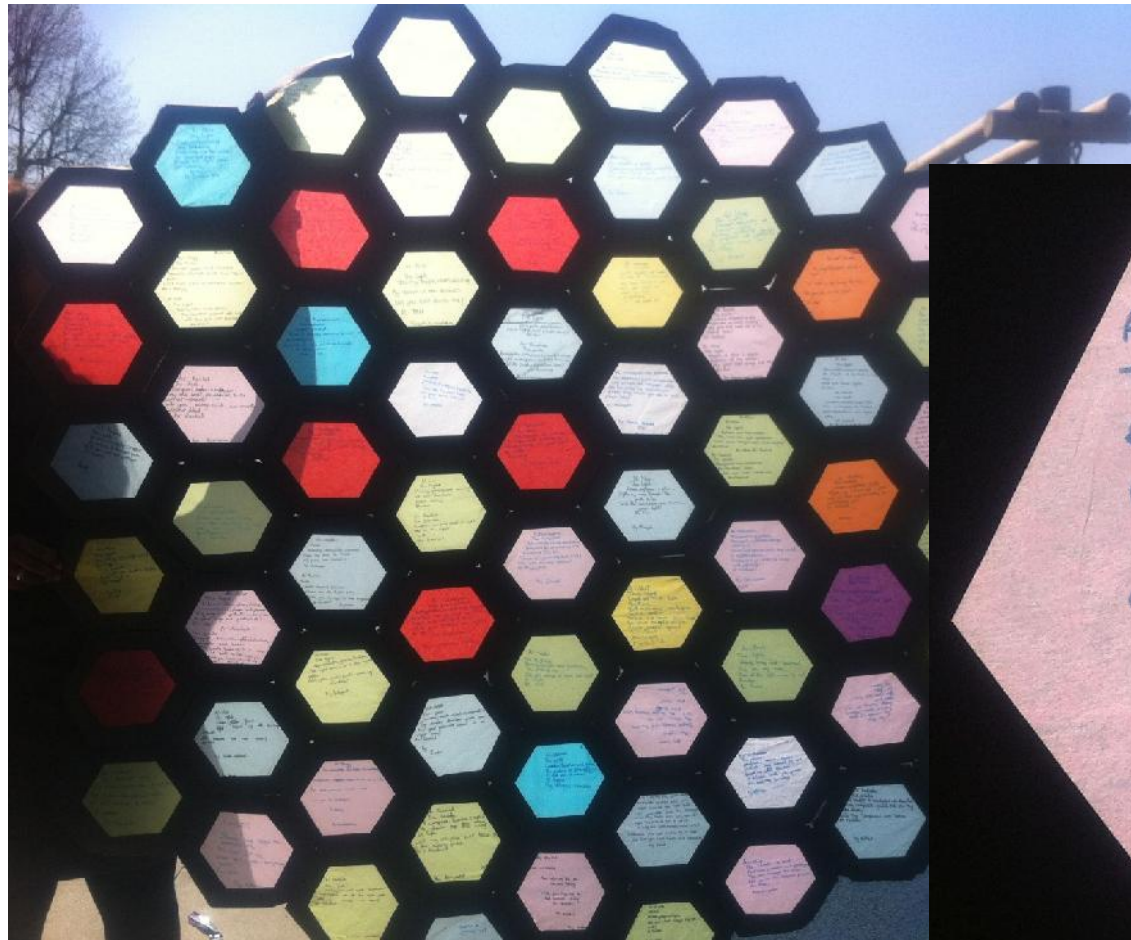
