Formally Student SACRE



Student RE Matters has been running in Newham for over five years now. It is known nationally for the innovative work it has produced on identity and faith sensitivities. Student SACRE gives students the opportunity of developing leadership skills, through the two years that they attend.

Student RE Matters provides schools with the opportunity to:

- **Promote dialogue** between young people of differing faiths and secular backgrounds and cultures, supporting collaborative work; and
- **Contribute to community benefit**, as it seeks to develop young people's skills in understanding their concerns and provides a place for them to learn to become a initiator and developer of solutions.

Student RE Matters exists to give Newham students a place where they can discuss spiritual and moral issues that are important to them. Every school has the opportunity to elect or send six– eight student representatives: 3-4 from Year 9, and 3-4 from Year 10, and a member of staff to attend the half termly meetings. The hope is that these students will be representatives of the different religious and secular world views in each school.

Student RE Matters elect yearly their own chair and vice chair who represent the group at adult SACRE meetings, and also have a place on the young majors cabinet. They work alongside Claire to plan and lead meetings.


Implementing the Newham 2011 New Agreed Syllabus

Teaching Inspiring RE
